Principal's Message

Hello and welcome to Week 5 of Term 4. We are now approaching the middle of the final term for our school year. Christmas holidays are just around the corner and you can feel the excitement starting to build as we see decorations appear and people are talking about the season. We now have less than six weeks of school to go. MacFarlane School will close at 2:40pm on Friday 16th of December 2022. We will be closed for six weeks with the students due back at school on Tuesday 31st of January 2023.

Over the first four weeks this term we have had an average enrolment of 187 with an average attendance of 62%. Our target for our attendance is 75% so we will need to do some more work in this area. We need to have all of the students at school every day so they can continue to learn and receive a great school education.

Over the last two Fridays our upper primary students have been able to attend interschool sport to play Dodge Ball against other schools. Our students love the game and have been able to win most of their matches, which is a fantastic result. Well done to all of our students who have been able to attend and play so well against students from other schools here in Katherine.

The Culture Program is now back up and running. Mr Arnold and Ms Levina will be working with all of our classes over the coming weeks to revise some of the things that took place earlier on this year and introduce some new activities to the students. All of our students really love the Culture Program and look forward to their turn to participate.

There will be a school council meeting tonight in the school's library from 5:30pm. If you have anything that you would like raised please contact the front office on 89651700. It is very important that we hear from our school community if there are things that need to be discussed and actioned.

I was fortunate enough to be able to attend the Department of Education Leaders' Summit for two days last week. The theme of the conference was One Sky, Many Voices. It focused on listening to the voices of all stakeholder groups in school communities and working to make sure everyone is included. There were a number of speakers throughout the two days and left me thinking what I should do to listen to our school community.

Please remember that everywhere around our school is a 40kph zone and in the car park it is 10kph. The safety of our students is so very important and at drop-off and pick-up times we all need to be very aware of what is going on. We are working with the Katherine Town Council to have extra signs installed on Grevillea Road and speed humps in our car park to help slow traffic down.

Well that's about it for me this week. I don't know about you but for me I am really looking forward to the rain. It has been so hot and sticky lately that some rain might help cool things down. Hopefully it won't be far away now. Until next week all the best!


This is a wonderful story of someone who really wants to come to school. Congratulations Robert on your big effort to get to school on Monday. Well done and keep up the good work in your classroom.
