Principal's Message

Hello and welcome to Week 3 of Term 1 for 2023. I hope everyone is now well settled into their school routines for this year. We have certainly had a busy start to the term. From this week all of our programs have now recommenced, and our teaching and learning programs are well underway.

Thank you to all families for supporting the school through getting all the kids to school. It has been wonderful to see so many smiling faces at school each day. In Week 2 our average daily attendance had jumped up to 74% across the school, which is fantastic. Our goal is to achieve an average of 75% attendance each and every week throughout the school year. There is still work to be done, but we are really heading in the right direction, so thank you.

Also, thank you to all families for your support of our pupil free day on Monday. It was a wonderful day where all teaching staff got the opportunity to work with our new mathematics program – Learning Through Doing. We are now planning all of our mathematics lessons using this new program.

Interschool sport started last Friday afternoon. It was great to see so many of our children taking up the chance to travel over to Katherine South School to play touch football against students from other schools here in Katherine. Please remember that only children who have been attending school on a regular basis, and have been working hard and listening to their teachers, will have the chance to attend. Thank you to Mr Jestin and Mr Cameran for looking after interschool sports once again this year, and to Mr Arnold for driving the bus.

Ms Shona Forsberg, a music teacher from the NT Music School, has commenced music lessons with one of our students. If you would like your child to be included in learning to play a musical instrument, please contact our office so we can start getting them involved in the program. We will also be offering choir practice each Monday. Ms Emma will be running practice sessions for all interested children. If they are interested they will have the opportunity to join children from all of the other Katherine schools as part of the choir for the Katherine Beat event. This will be held in June this year.

Ms Lucie, from the Edge of Nowhere Foundation (EON), will be starting gardening and healthy cooking lessons once again this week. The students are always enthusiastic about getting into the garden and using the produce to cook healthy meals. It is great to have this partnership up and running again at our school. We are very grateful to have Ms Lucie back with us again.

Just another reminder that we have a breakfast program that runs each morning from 7:30-8:15am. Everyone is most welcome to attend as they drop their child(ren) off to school. It is a great way to start the school day. Thank you to Ms Donna and Ms Mariah for all of their hard work to prepare the food for breakfast each morning.






